Respectful Relationships

At Christmas Hills Primary School we are committed to creating and maintaining safe and inclusive learning and working environments for everyone. We ensure our students feel safe, included and happy at school. When students feel a strong sense of belonging and connectedness at school it improves engagement and learning.

The staff support students to build self-esteem and agency as learners. We are a highly inclusive school where all children, staff, families and community members are valued. Every child at Christmas Hills Primary School is supported in their social and emotional development in a caring way. We help students build skills in empathy and positive relationships, in a framework centred around our school values of CHIRPS – Caring, Honesty, Inquisitiveness, Respect, Persistence, Sharing.

The Victorian Curriculum provides the basis for what we teach about respectful relationships and identifies the knowledge, skills and understanding students need to engage in respectful and positive relationships. Delivering the Victorian Curriculum is compulsory for all government schools. The Respectful Relationships initiative supports schools to promote and model respect, positive attitudes and behaviours. It supports students to face life's challenges by developing problem-solving skills and building resilience and confidence as well as teaching them how to build healthy relationships.

As discussed in our last School Council meeting, the topics we will explore in a sequential, age appropriate manner in 2024 include:

Emotional Literacy: Emotional literacy can be defined as the ability to understand ourselves and other people.

Personal Strengths: Children and young people need a vocabulary to help them recognise and understand strengths and positive qualities in themselves and others.

Positive Coping: When children and young people develop a language around coping, they are more likely to be able to understand and deliberately utilise a range of productive coping strategies.

Problem Solving: Problem-solving skills are an important part of the coping repertoire.

Stress Management: Assisting students to recognise their personal signs and symptoms of stress, and to develop strategies that will help them to deal with stress effectively, will help students cope with future challenges.

Help Seeking: This topic area is designed to help students discuss the importance of seeking help and providing peer support when dealing with problems that are too big to solve alone.

We will continue to share the topics we are exploring and our learning at school throughout 2023 and into 2024. This will allow you to discuss topics and share strategies at home as well.




Mental Health Fund and Menu

The Victorian Government has invested \$217.8 million over 4 years to support student mental health and wellbeing, including approximately \$200 million over 4 years and \$86 million ongoing to create a Schools Mental Health Fund. Underpinning the Fund is the evidence-based Schools Mental Health Menu.

One of the priority areas and actions identified in the Christmas Hills Primary School Annual Implementation Program (AIP) is to implement a bullying prevention program across the school. We considered the Mental Health Menu and the programs and initiatives that best matched our contexts and cohort of learners and decided that the Friendly Schools approach was a good fit given its whole school approach, shared language, evidence base and focus on social and emotional wellbeing of students.

Same-Day Notification Of Unexplained Student Absences

fact sheet for parents/carers

If your child is sick or absent, you are required to notify their school as soon as possible **on the day of absence** using one of the following methods:

Online: log the absence directly using your school's IT platform.

Telephone: the school office and let the staff know your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.

Email: the school and provide the staff with your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.

Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

Why do I need to notify the school if my child is absent?

Schools need to know when and why a child is absent and you need to know if your child isn't at school.

From the end of Term 2 2018, all Victorian government schools are required to contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. If your child is absent on a particular day and you have not contacted the school to explain why, the absence will be marked as unexplained.

This system also promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education, they learn new things every day – missing school puts them behind.

What is your responsibility?

You are legally required to ensure your child attends school every day or you must provide an explanation for their absence. You should let the school know in advance of any upcoming absences or let them know in the morning if your child won't be at school. In order for schools to implement the same day notification requirement, it's essential that you provide the school with your most up-to-date contact details.

Generally one notification will be sent per family. Should there be circumstances that require both parents and carers to be notified, please contact the school to make the necessary arrangements.

What is the school's responsibility?

The school must notify you of an unexplained absence in relation to your child as soon as practicable on the same day.



Schools will let you know either by your school's online communications app, SMS, phone call or email. If you can't be reached because the school does not have your correct contact details (i.e. changed phone number, SMS/email failure notification received etc.), the school will attempt to make contact with any emergency contact/s nominated on your child's file held by the school. Where possible, this contact will be made on the same day of the unexplained absence.

Where can I learn more about the process for managing student absences?

Ask your school for a copy of the Attendance Policy which outlines the school's processes and procedures

EVERY DAY COUNTS

Primary School Attendance

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things are school every day—missing school puts them behind.

Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

Getting in early

Attendance patterns are established early – a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school.

What we can do

The main reasons for absence are:

Sickness – There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term if it can be avoided.

Day off" – Think twice before letting your child have a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates – every day counts. "

Truancy – This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's permission. There can be many reasons for truancy. The best way to address this is for schools and parents to work together.

If for any reason your child must miss school, there are things you can do with your school to ensure they don't fall behind:

- Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up.
- Develop an absence learning plan with your teacher and ensure your child completes the plan.

Remember, every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher as early as possible.

Openly communicating with your child's school about all absences is a good way to prevent attendance issues being escalated to a School Attendance Officer. A School Attendance Officer is a Department of Education and Early Childhood Development Regional Director who has authority to follow up attendance issues. Attendance issues that are escalated can lead to an Infringement Notice. I f you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.
