Sugarloaf reservoir is one of the best kept secrets in Nillumbik and is a great place to visit and sail. Being land-locked and patrolled it is one of the safest places to learn to sail. Sugarloaf Sailing Club has a program designed to encourage everyone to sail. Both adults and children can join the Fleet 101 as family members or as individuals.

Sugarloaf Sailing Club runs a weekly program for sailors from 8 years and up during the warmer months. This is a great way to get into and learn sailing. The Club is currently running its Fleet 101 sailing training session on Saturday mornings, called Fleet 101. This is run by an experienced sailing instructor who has been running these sessions for many years. Our aim is for students to be able to handle a sailing boat with confidence and to enjoy sailing. We do this through on water training, coaching and experience.

Capacity is 10 students, training boats and life jackets are provided. Students can be from 8 Years of age up to adults. This is a perfect sport that the family can enjoy together. The total training cost is a student membership, which is \$106. There are also family memberships available. (More details on website Sailsugarloaf.com)

The membership also covers free access to the patrolled reservoir and all sailing club facilities on all sailing days.

Unlimited, free use of the club fleet comprising a range of catamarans and dinghies.

Free advice and assistance from our specialist boat maintenance crew.

Access to the Club's store of spare boat fittings, lines, spars, and tools.

The right to, from time to time, bring guests to the Club.

Fair weather sailing often takes place on Sundays with usually a BBQ available with the picnic facilities and can be a fantastic family day out.

Sailing is a great sport but it can also be a lifestyle, a profession and a way of thinking.
