This meeting will take place in Bunjil at 3.30pm – Wednesday 22nd November.



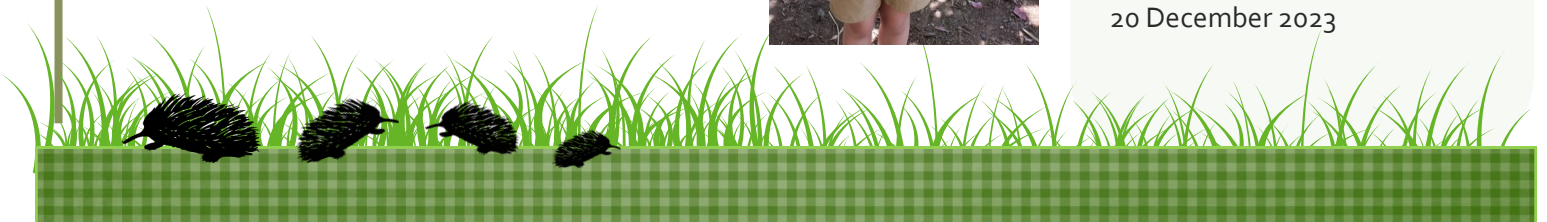

Our Prep transition sessions have now commenced and are running each Friday from 9.00-11.00am in Quip Quip up until 1st December.

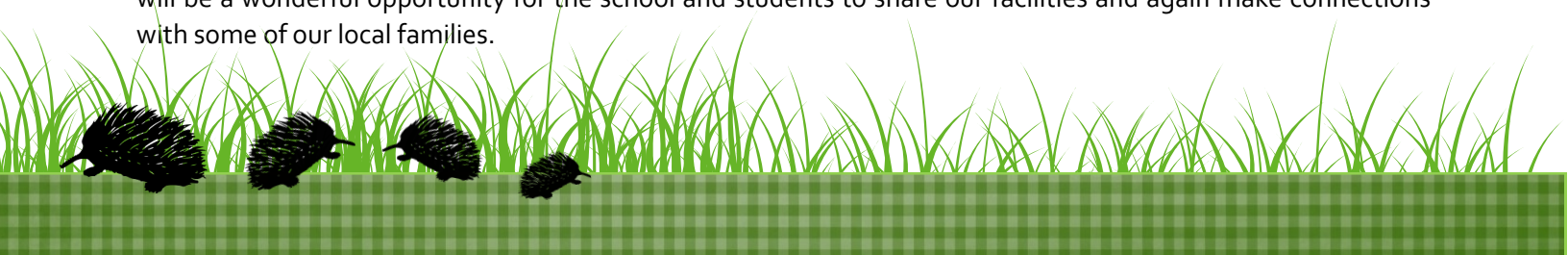
Swimming

Students in remembrance

veterans who have given their lives in combat for Australia and Commonwealth nations are remembered once again on Saturday 11 November.

The Remembrance Day services took place in Yarra Glen and Healesville as well as other areas in Yarra Valley.

Yarra Glen Returned and Services League president Stephen Shortis said he was emotional because this year's service would be his 51st in Yarra Glen.

"I have been doing this for a long period of time and I want to say thank you to all the people who helped me," he said.

Local veterans, RSL members and Yarra Glen Primary School students took part in the service.

The service started with a welcome address by Yarra Glen RSL secretary Edward Bartosh. An excerpted letter from Walter George Orr from Bullecourt, France in December 1918 was read by George Miller.

Yarra Glen Primary School leaders Lachlan and Claire Lofaro recited the poems In Flanders Fields and The Victory Emblem respectively.

Lachlan said he was grateful for getting an opportunity to recite the poem.

"I usually like to participate in Anzac Day and Remembrance Day because I have some of my uncles who fought in the war," he said. Claire said she was nervous for awhile, but she got off the nerve. She was able to talk about how important it was to do the service.

"It's important to commemorate and remember all the people who participated in the war and helped our country," she said.

After the students' recitations, Mike Watkins recited The Ode, followed by a one-minute silence while Last Post was played by Gabby Shortis with her bugle.

Local community groups and attendees laid wreaths and poppies.

Yarra Glen RSL secretary Edward Bartosh said the service went very well, even though it's normally a smaller crowd than Anzac Day.

"It's our duty to remember those who have gone before us and we will keep doing this whether there's 20 or 400 attendees," he said.

Yarra Glen Girl Guides was on the site standing around the Cenotaph and helping raise and lower the flags during the service.

Queen's Guide recipient Erin Allison said she has participated in the service since 2013.

"This would be my 10th year doing this and I have enjoyed and liked allowing the other girls to do it and watching them step up and be part of the community," she said.

"Today, we have four girls standing around the Cenotaph and organising their formation. We also helped raise and lower the flags."

Christmas Hill Primary School principal Maria Parks emphasised the importance of passing the spirit of Remembrance Day down to the younger generation.

"Today, two of my students took part in the laying of wreaths. It's really important for young people to take part in these kinds of services to help them understand the history behind these special days we celebrate," she said.

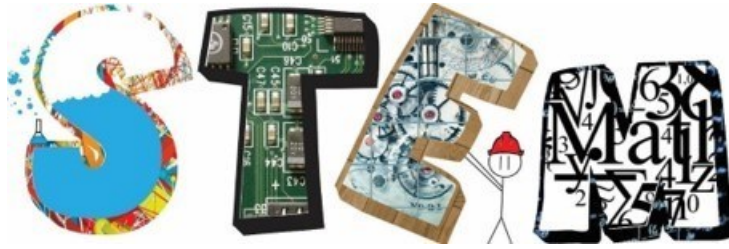

The session will begin at 3:30 in Bunjil. This session will share very important information about the new FDR system and the Emergency Procedures our school has in place to support the safety of students during the upcoming bushfire season. We will be joined by representatives from the Christmas Hills CFA.

We strongly recommend a representative from each family attends this session.

Newsletter article: Schools in Category 0, 1 and 2 on the Bushfire At-Risk Register

This information has been developed to answer frequently asked questions regarding the Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) and your school's pre-emptive actions on elevated fire danger days.

School preparations for the bushfire season

Each year, to prepare for bushfires and grassfires, schools and early childhood services complete a range of activities.

The Department of Education runs an annual fire risk assessment of schools and early childhood services. They are allocated a category of risk (categories 0 to 4) and are published on the Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR).



On elevated fire danger days schools in the highest levels of risk (categories 0, 1 and 2) take pre-emptive actions to minimise the risk of being caught in a fire in these conditions.

These actions are based on the Local Government Area they are in and their fire risk category.

In addition, all schools and services listed on the BARR and Category 4 list will close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district.

When the Bureau of Meteorology provides public fire danger rating forecasts, they use fire weather district areas. In Victoria, there are 9 fire weather districts, which include numerous Local Government Areas. Our school is in the **Central fire weather district**.

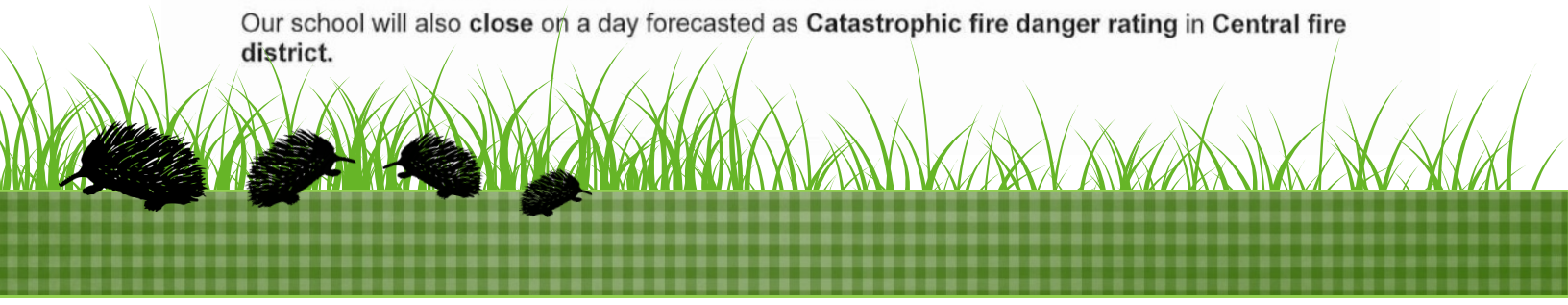
As part of preparing our school for the fire season, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan and such as reprioritised any maintenance works that may assist in preparing for the threat of fire and cleared our facility's grounds and gutters.

What does this mean for our school?

Our school has been identified as being in one of the highest fire risk categories - BARR 1

Our school will action its pre-emptive plan for **relocation** on a day forecasted as **Extreme fire danger rating** in our **local government area (LGA), Nillumbik**.

Our school will also **close** on a day forecasted as **Catastrophic fire danger rating** in **Central fire district**.



What is the department's policy?

The department's [Bushfire and Grassfire Preparedness Policy](#) requires schools at high risk of bushfire to enact pre-emptive action plans based on LGA level fire danger forecasts. Conditions can vary significantly across the wider weather district, so using local forecasts helps us to respond appropriately to risks in our local area and maintain stability and educational continuity for our students and school community. This policy is consistent for all schools at high levels of risk and this approach is supported by emergency services.

The policy also requires that all schools and early childhood services on the BARR and the Category 4 list close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district. All school bus routes which travel in or through a district with Catastrophic fire danger must also be cancelled.

When will our school enact our pre-emptive action plan?

Our school will action our pre-emptive plan to **Kangaroo Ground Primary School** on days when the fire danger forecast for our local government area, Nillumbik is **Extreme**.

Our school will use the LGA forecast confirmed by emergency services the day before an Extreme fire danger day in our LGA to trigger our plan. We will let you know when we are enacting our pre-emptive action plan. Please be aware that no one will be on site on days where the school has enacted this plan.

What do we do when our LGA has a different fire danger rating to the wider fire weather district?

As we respond to local conditions, there may be days during the fire season when our fire weather district, Central is forecast as an Extreme fire danger rating, but our LGA is at a lower level of fire danger. On these days our school operations will continue as normal, however we will be taking action in line with fire services advice by:

- checking our Emergency Management Plan and taking any necessary preparedness actions
- actively monitor our local conditions and warnings
- having plans and procedures in place for if a fire starts to support us to take immediate action.

While our school will continue to operate, we encourage our school community to consider their own [bushfire survival plan](#) and reassess any travel through bushfire risk areas. We encourage you to follow your family bushfire survival plan and the advice of emergency services.

There may also be days where our LGA is forecast as Extreme fire danger, but Central is not. On these days we **will** enact our pre-emptive action plan.

When will our school be closed due to Catastrophic fire danger?

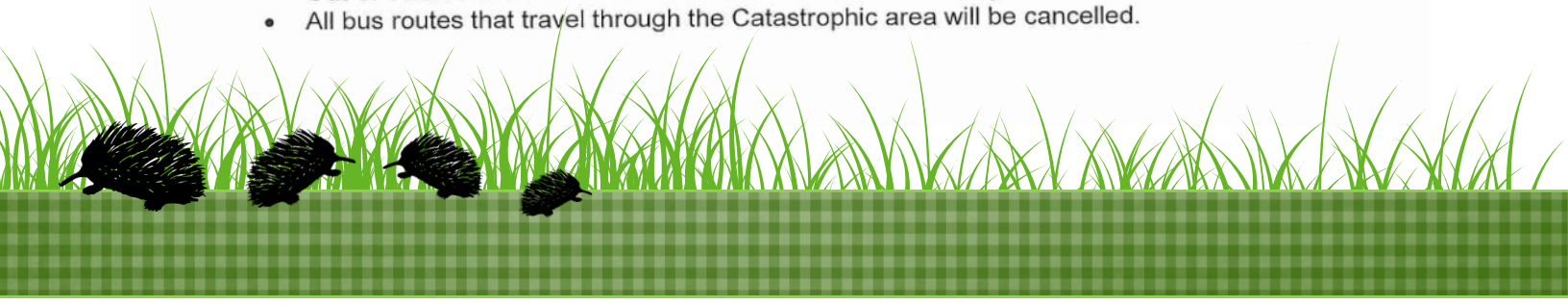
Our school will also **close** on a day forecasted as **Catastrophic fire danger rating in Central fire district**.

Closure of the school due to a forecast Catastrophic day will be confirmed on the day prior and we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day. Any information regarding potential or confirmed Catastrophic fire danger days will be communicated to you by Sentral

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, even if the weather forecast changes.

This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to be aware that:

- No one will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Catastrophic day.
- Out-of-school-hours care will also be cancelled on these days.
- All bus routes that travel through the Catastrophic area will be cancelled.



- School camps will be cancelled if a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast for fire weather district in which the camp is located, or if the travel involves passing through areas that have Catastrophic fire danger.

Families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan on Catastrophic fire danger rating days. **On such days, children should never be left at home alone or in the care of older children.**

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Catastrophic days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Catastrophic day.

What can families and the school community do to help us prepare?

- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers.
- Keep in touch with us by - reading our newsletters, checking our website <https://www.christmashillsp.vic.edu.au/>, by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching staff about our emergency management plan.
- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is relocated or closed due to fire danger. Further information can be found on the [CFA's website](#).
- Enact your family's bushfire survival plan if your own triggers are met. Our school community may be spread out across many areas and some families may be at higher risk than others. Your family's safety is critical, so please let us know if you are enacting your bushfire survival plan and if your children will be absent on these days.
- If your child is old enough, talk to [them about bushfires](#) and your family's bushfire survival plan.

Prep and Year One Sessions

\$297 including GST

Students are required to enrol for the three weeks.
Total of 4.5 hours of instruction.

Run by our early years specialist Smitha, lessons will allow students to build and review early literacy skills needed for both reading and writing. The lessons will also focus on key early numeracy skills mostly based on number sense.

Prep Sessions

These sessions will be designed for children who are just about to start Prep.

Over the course of 3 weeks, students will gain a foundation in Literacy skills that will help them feel confident and ready to begin their first year of school. Through stories and songs, they will learn about the relationship between letters and sounds and how this relationship helps us to read and write. They will also gain beginning numeracy skills through a variety of games and hands-on activities. Some of the topics covered include counting, 2D shapes and patterns.

Year One Sessions

These sessions will be designed for children who have completed Prep and are going into year 1.

Students will review concepts that they have been taught in their Foundation year to help consolidate their understanding before heading into the new school year. They will build their word decoding skills and further develop their ability to comprehend and discuss texts. They will work on their emerging writing skills with a focus on taking speech to print with proper writing conventions such as punctuation. Key numeracy topics such as place value, addition and subtraction will also be covered.

Sessions will be 90 minutes long. Students will be allocated a group and will attend for three consecutive weeks.

Prep students will be required to attend a pre-assessment with Smitha on Friday 5th January. You will be provided with a time closer to the date.

Writing Sessions

\$132 including GST

Students can attend one session. Total of 2 hours of instruction.

Run by our writing expert, Vanda, our writing lessons will have a different focus each week. Students will be grouped primarily by age.

Week One: With a creative writing focus, students will go home with a short story.

Week Two: Students will research a topic of choice and create an information report. Students will go home with a poster of their work.

Week Three: NAPLAN Writing Assessment preparation. Students will practise completing previous NAPLAN Writing assessments in preparation for the NAPLAN in March, 2024.

Each session runs for 2 hours. You can enrol in just one week, or as many as you like.

Multisensory Structured Language Sessions

\$264 including GST

Students are required to enrol for Day One and Day Two sessions.
Total of 4 hours of instruction.

Run by our director, Giulia, lessons will allow students the time to deep dive into reading and spelling skills. MSL lessons focus on reading, spelling, reading fluency, comprehension and handwriting.

Instruction is explicit, direct, systematic and multisensory. This means that it targets all learning pathways to the brain simultaneously to enhance learning and memory.

Children will come for a total of four hours across two days. You can enrol for one week, or multiple weeks, however grouping will change each week based on enrolments.

Prep students will be required to attend a pre-assessment with Giulia on Friday 5th January and will then be allocated an appropriate group.

Maths Sessions

\$132 excluding GST

Students can attend one session. Total of 2 hours of instruction.

Run by our Numeracy Coordinator, Elizabeth, our Maths sessions will have a different theme for each day. All days will be mostly hands on learning experiences, with more of an open ended approach to accommodate for all abilities. Below is a short summary of what to expect for each day.

Week One - Monday: A day on fractions

Develop a better understanding of 'Fractions of a Group' and 'Fractions of One' through some pretend food based play

Week One - Tuesday: Maths Based Art Day

Use your knowledge of 2D Shapes and Measurement to create a one of a kind piece of art

Week Two - Monday: A day on shapes and nets

Spend the session building and working with 3D models

Week Two - Tuesday: Digital Maths Games Day

Digital games that focus on Quick Maths for the four processes (Addition, Subtraction, Division and Multiplication.)

Week Three - Monday: NAPLAN Practice

A day all about working through practice exams and understanding what is being asked for each section of the test. Brain breaks will be integrated as needed.

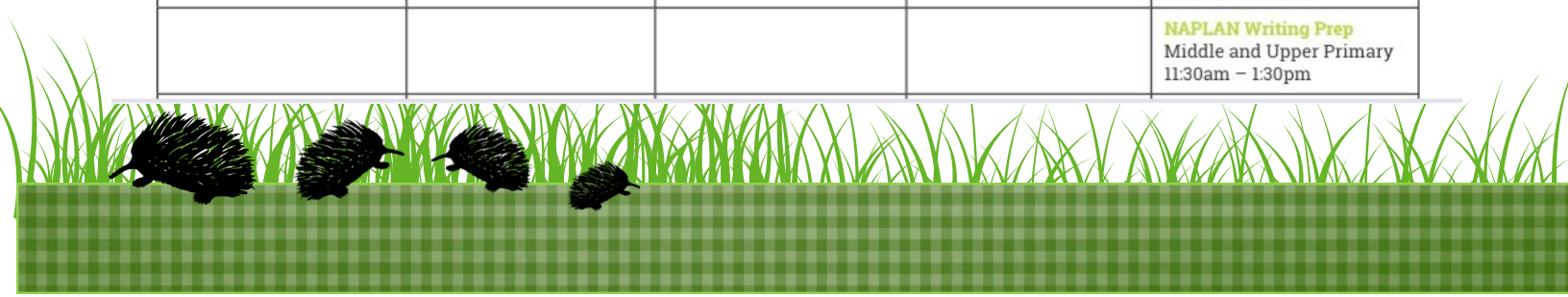
Week Three - Tuesday: Maths Dictionary Day

Less hands on but very practical! Students will develop a Maths Dictionary that can be used throughout the school year. The dictionary can help with homework and can also help develop students' knowledge and understanding of a topic prior to a unit commencing at school. Digital games will be offered between dictionary pages as a Brain Break.

Once final groups are confirmed, lessons will be slightly modified to ensure all students can achieve success. Each session runs for 2 hours. You can enrol in just one session, or as many as you like.

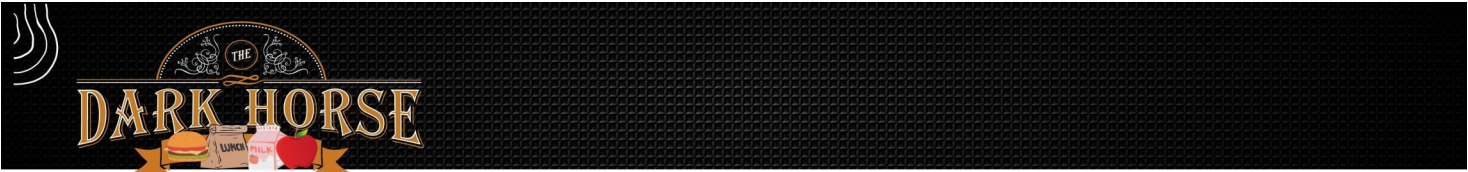
